

Africa Queen Quilt

For each block cut:

Background (White)

(2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles

(2) $3 \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles

Face and hands (Brown)

(2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ square for hands

(1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ square for face

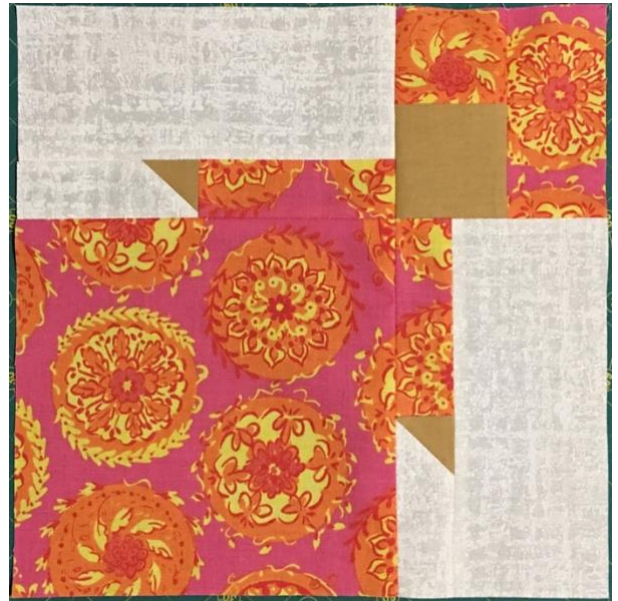
Dress, Sleeves and Headwrap

(1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ square for dress

(2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ for sleeves

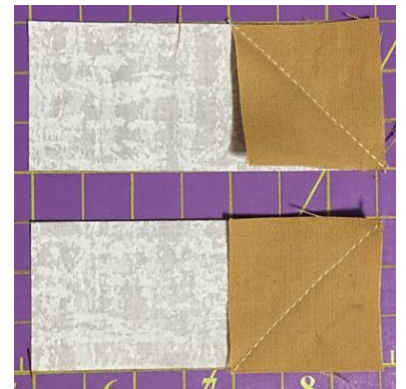
(1) $2 \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ for headwrap

(1) 2×4 for headwrap



All seams are $\frac{1}{4}''$. Press all seams open.

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the (2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$ squares for hands.
2. Snowball squares onto the (2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ background rectangles, alternating the angle as shown to the right. Trim and press.
3. Sew each of (2) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ sleeves onto the hand units made in Step 2.
4. Sew together (1) $2 \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ headwrap onto (1) $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ face, then sew (1) 2×4 headwrap onto face/headwrap unit.
5. Arrange pieces and sew together. You can choose whether her palms are closed or open by switching and rotating the arm units:



6. Square up to $9\frac{3}{4}''$.
